## Diaper Boom!

Diapers and formula are notoriously expensive, however diaper insecurity is a need that

is often overlooked. Diaper need is defined as a lack of sufficient diapers needed to keep babies dry, clean, and healthy. According to the National Diaper Bank Network, of the 11 million babies aged 0-3 years of age, 47% of them are low income, furthermore a third of moms in the US report suffering from diaper need. Despite the very real and growing need for diapers, 100% of direct diaper assistance programs are non-governmental. Those receiving welfare are able to purchase diapers with their benefits, however, only 27% of families in need receive this cash assistance.



One of Neighbors in Need's programs is the Infants in Need program, created to fill the need for diapers in Greater Lawrence. The program offers 20-50 diapers (depending on size) per child per month to families who need them. We also provide formula, wipes, clothing, and other essential items when they are donated to NIN. In 2018, the Infants in Need program was able to distribute 54,325 diapers to families suffering from diaper need- more than triple the prior year!



The difference between having diapers and not greatly impacts the economic prosperity of a family. Diapers cost a family between \$60-\$80 a month, and on average children use 6-10 diapers per day. Daycare facilities require that children be sent to the program with an adequate amount of diapers for the week. This means when parents cannot afford diapers, they cannot send their children to daycare programs, and are therefore unable to go to a job of their own, further exacerbating this cycle of poverty and unmet needs.

We are so blessed by all of our wonderful donors that generously donate diapers, wipes, formula, and other

baby items. Without your support we would not be able to do this important work to support the youngest member of the community.



Neighbors In Need fights hunger locally by distributing healthy food at 13 Food Pantries strategically located in the neighborhoods of Greater Lawrence. 9 of these pantries are open to the public. NIN also helps hungry infants and infants with diaper need, by providing caregivers formula, diapers and other necessities for children under the age of 5 at our Lawrence office.

## Andover Green Schools Wins EPA Award



In December of 2018 the Andover Public Schools' "Green Schools" food rescue program was recognized by the Environmental Protection Agency for its success in education and community outreach on the issue of food waste. The Green Schools program began in 2017 to ensure that students were recycling appropriate materials, and soon expanded to recover unopened, wholesome food that was being thrown away by students to be repurposed to feed the hungry in the community. Additionally, other food waste was diverted to composting instead of the trash can. In 2017 alone, 226 tons of food was redirected from the incinerator, 9,000 pounds of which were donated to Neighbors in Need for distribution in our pantries.





Many thanks to the food rescue volunteers that pick up food every Friday afternoon from Andover schools and deliver it to the NIN warehouse. You are an integral part of our operations!
